Veterans Day Assembly



On 10 Nov. the Lancer Battalion and Lakes HS held its annual Veterans Day Assembly in the Lakes Gym. The event featured performances from our Saber, Color Guard, Armed and Unarmed Drill, and Lakes' Jazz Band. The event was emceed by C/2LT Clark, being kicked off by our own honor guard.

We then had our parade of the flags of the armed services, followed by the Prisoners of War table presentation by C/PV1 Munoz-Gomez. Our award winning Armed and Unarmed Drill teams performed individually before transitioning into a "hybrid" performance including the duos of C/CPT Boggs, and C/MSG Adkins on Armed, and C/2LT Cruz and C/1SG Morrow on unarmed. The crowds of students erupted in cheers for the presentation from the Drill teams. Our Lakes Jazz Band provided instrumentals for our assembly, with C/PV1 Jewett playing the Tenor Saxophone. We also had some honored guests come to our assembly, including blinded veterans from the nearby American Lake VA hospital, and some active duty service members from Joint Base Lewis-McChord.

Battalion Fundraiser

The annual fundraiser was a success, selling over \$10,000 in cookie dough. Bravo 1 had the most amount of money with \$50.26 per cadet, Bravo 2 came in 2nd and Bravo 3 came in 3rd. Cadet Cruz (Bravo Company Commander) brought in the most individual money with around \$900, Cadet Jones brought in around \$400 for 2nd, and Cadet Ashford came in 3rd with around \$350 in sales. The profits from the fundraiser will benefit our cadets with the money going to buy more uniforms, classroom supplies, and much more.
