### **PLU Raider Challenge**

Our raiders geared up to compete at PLU on Sunday, March 23rd. Little did we know

they would later return with the championship title! Our amazing raider commander c/1LT Ava Santiago led her team to victory using her superior leadership skills to guide them throughout the competition.

So, what all did they do to secure their victory? First, they did a 1.5-mile ruck where they placed first and earned the ability to decide what they did next. Then they did a "grenade" throw. (no real grenades were used, obviously) After that, they went through a physical fitness assessment. The physical fitness test included running one lap, doing 20 burpees, moving a tractor tire 25 meters, and finally the army sprint, drag, and carry. Next, they did a written test on US History and Government



with a mental agility event when they finished. Once the mental aspect was done, the cadets prepared themselves for a medevac scenario that included a stretcher. They finished the competition off with a rope bridge. Though our raiders had little to no experience with the rope bridge, they were still able to pull through and execute the drill



to a high degree.

Once the event was over, it was clear who came out on top. Our raider team consisted of cadets Gavin Thiessen, Wyatt Blanchard, Kody Chang, Jacob Herrera, Jackson Lord, Kaiden Jeanniton, Elira Blanchard, Reagan Lord, Carl Sambuena, and Commander Ava Santiago. Santiago's leadership was so great that the PLU Cadets and Cadre unanimously voted for her to receive the Commanders Leadership
